FROM RESERVOIR TO PETROL PUMP –

FLOW MEASUREMENT CHALLENGES IN THE PETROLEUM INDUSTRY

The world's relentless demand for oil and gas has been a motivation for petroleum companies to continually look for ways to advance oil and gas production techniques. Objectives have included making marginal fields more cost effective, establishing production facilities in increasingly difficult physical environments, reducing development costs and improving the energy efficiency of new fields. Flow measurement has had an important part to play in all of these.

Whether it is measuring multiphase flow rates deep in the reservoir or measuring the flow of a separated gas stream for fiscal purposes, the petroleum sector presents a range of fascinating flow measurements problems.

Professor Richard Thorn will discuss how techniques, ranging from those which have been in use since early in the last century to the latest tomographic imaging techniques, are being used to meet these challenges.
