Professionally he was a singer, conductor, arranger and composer; he was heavily involved with many local musical and Light Operatic groups and was a Founder Member of the Hanwell Festival and joint Founder of the Ealing Jazz Festival (this while he was Events Manager for Ealing Council). Bev's musical interests spread widely: for many years he served on the Ealing Arts Council and was Chairman of the Music Section; his experience and knowledge was much appreciated. He was the popular and much-loved organist and choirmaster at St Thomas' Church, Boston Manor, where his funeral was attended by many representatives from Ealing Arts and Leisure.

The artistic side of our EA+L members shows through at Art classes and Exhibitions all over the Borough – and with longer days to enjoy, it is time to remove the lens cap and explore and record the unusual, the mundane and the hidden corners of our ever-changing Borough. For those inclined towards a spotlight on Drama, do seek out the interesting surprises detailed between these covers. Take part in your choices, and enjoy this coming Summer Season.
