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By the time you read this Editorial, the result should be known of the recent **hearing into Ealing Council's application for a Compulsory Purchase Order (CPO)** which, if successful, will signal the start of the Land Securities' comprehensive project to build a new cinema, 161 flats and more retail space in central Ealing.

If the CPO is refused by the Secretary of State then the earlier scheme by Empire Cinemas is likely to be built, hopefully with modifications.

Either way a new cinema is at last likely to be built in central Ealing. This is good news for film lovers. However, neither scheme includes any dedicated performance or cultural space, for which **Ealing Arts + Leisure** and the **Campaign for an Ealing Performance and Arts Centre (CEPAC)** have crusaded for many years.

Discussions with the Council and developers are planned to take place in October on how and where such a cultural space could be located and financed.

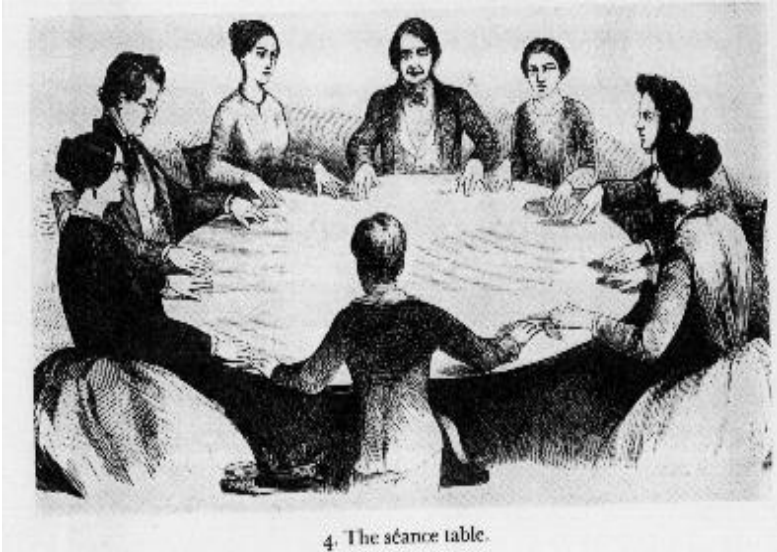
